Leadership Reflection

"A Christian who does not protect Creation, who does not let it grow, is a Christian who does not care about the work of God, that work that was born from the love of God for us. And this is the first response to the first creation: protect creation, make it grow.

Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start, despite their mental and social conditioning." - Pope Francis, Laudato Si on 'Care for our Common Home'

I often return to these words from Pope Francis' 2015 Encyclical when working with the Sustainability Team.

Last week I saw something particularly wholesome that embodied them in an unlikely place; a Facebook post on a Wangaratta Community page. Amongst the items for sale and local gripes, somebody posted a photo of an elderly gentleman who had been spotted walking around town with a rubbish bag and grabber tool, cleaning up litter around the car parks near the creek.

Many people praised his actions, and the comment section turned into a lively discussion of organising funds and volunteers to support him. The post reached his daughter who confirmed the gentleman cleans up the area each week, and that he was very touched but a little shocked by all the fuss! The man's committed and humble actions had inspired many.

It was a wonderful reminder that even the simple things we do to care for God's Creation, particularly what we do when we think no one is looking, can have wider impacts than we may be aware of.

As we pass the Winter Solstice this week and head into our holiday break, take the time to appreciate and care for the natural environment we are so fortunate to have in our region. Enjoy the bare trees, frosty mornings and stormy sunsets, as signs that we too should do what nature does at this time- go slow, rest and recover, prepare for Spring.

"The universe unfolds in God, who fills it completely. Hence, there is a mystical meaning to be found in a leaf, in a mountain trail, in a dewdrop, in a poor person's face. The ideal is not only to pass from the exterior to the interior to discover the action of God in the soul, but also to discover God in all things." Laudato Si, 233



School Vaccination Program

The Meningococcal ACWY vaccination program is being conducted at this school tomorrow, Thursday 24 June 2021.

The following vaccines will be offered on this day:

Year Level	Vaccine offered
Year 10 Male & Female Students	NIMENRIX (Meningococcal ACWY) 1 DOSE ONLY

These vaccinations are funded as part of the Victorian Secondary School Vaccination Program. Should your child miss out on starting their vaccination course this year they may not be eligible to receive them for free in subsequent years.

Parent information packs were sent home recently.

ALL relevant sections of the consent card must be completed, signed and returned to the school even if your child is NOT being vaccinated.

To consent to your child being vaccinated please tick and sign the relevant YES sections of the consent card in blue or black pen. If you DO NOT wish to have your child vaccinated or if your child has already been vaccinated, please tick the relevant NO section on the consent card. All cards must be returned to the school by Friday 18 June 2021. Please return the card to the school even if your child is not being vaccinated.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by emailing your withdrawal of consent to Council's Immunisation Team on immunise@wodonga.vic.gov.au before the vaccination day.

Please ensure that your child is wearing their sports uniform or a short sleeve shirt on the day of vaccinations (without too many layers underneath), this will enable a smooth vaccination process.

If you have any enquiries about the program or your child's vaccinations, please contact Wodonga Council's Immunisation Team on 1800 655 360.




